OKAY – the Editor will wrap up this opening article on the world of Silicon Valley Classic # 6 with bottom line stats for some compare and contrast with past shows, also lending some insight details for those interested in entrant focus.

STATS & SUCH FOR SIXTH SILICON VALLEY CLASSIC 3/16/19

92 MODELERS ENTERED 330 Items (total 345+ models on table, as 3 collections = items within "3 entry items")

(8 more modelers 1 less model entries than last year)

79 Senior, 7 Junior, 6 Youth (Subjunior) class contestants in divisions (1 more Senior, 3 more Junior, 4 more Youth)

*Breakdown: Of original 48 Senior categories, NONE had no entries, with ONE split

Of original 5 Junior categories, ONE had NO entries with no splits required Of original 4 Youth categories, NONE had NO entries with no splits required

*Entries: 1 categories had NO entry, each in Junior

0 categories had only ONE entry (GREAT OUTCOME)

7 categories had only TWO entries, 6 in Senior, 1 in Youth

With no split packages available atop the 57 categories ended up using ONE (had 1 potential due 1 no entry cat)

There you have it, the "official numbers" for Silicon Valley Classic # 6, showing a fabulous return on our investment.

YES, it is true, the Editor and designated Official Head Judge did in fact arrive fashionably late in the contest day (but in time to do his due diligence, mind you!). This is for a reason and in and agreement worked with Contest Dir., although this year Mr Burton did take that timing to the edge of the envelope perhaps. Such is life.

However, this was only the second SVSM event my dearest Uschi and her youngest had been able to attend. I didn't want to show up with no plans to make their experience worthwhile repeating. Both wanted to be helpful to the cause and were indeed just that. Whence we arrived. Mama took many many excellent photographs with minimal or none at all input from moi, throughout the day. Whilst The Scientist Maria and I began getting the Judge's Meeting, then the process of Judging underway with minimal staff. Which neatly provided final impetus to "OJT" a now newly minted Model Judge Maria, as we two did in fact handle 18 categories mostly by ourselves. Also managed to get in train some "Special Awards" final decision work in that mission time. Before getting the data ready all "just in time, sort of" to begin Awards Ceremony and complete the event for this year. Again, in that a major thanks here owed, to patience of Young William Ferrante who put up with me, Mama and Scientist during that delightful time known as "where are the results?"...(insert favorite expletives). We launched the Ceremony while still finishing the end portion data process, and I chased down the Judges, sticking points in just enough time to have almost (but not quite), no major glitches in awards presentation. If you ever want to know too, too, well where Comm mishaps can and will occur, try being staff.

Okay, with again some edited pictures handily shot by Uschi during event, I wish to put in thanks to our Vendors now:







It's always a delight when "theme" concepts for an event come to be realized as entry subjects, even more so when they are rendered as the beautiful "working brush fire rig" here seen. I shot only these two and now more than ever, have wished I spent more time to record more of.

The prolific and oh so fearless Mr Herb Deeks of Anaheim, brought this grand entry our way.

Herb had also entered this year's Classic with something that I'd so puzzled over when I shot this picture of it, and still didn't recall the episode of "The Wild Wild West" which he refers to it on entry.





Here on the left, "The Turtle". Now I will put forth what I have since learnt, for those few of you who may like to know. This intriguing bit of armored vehicle was the "secret weapon" of an arms merchant in episode 25 of season 1, as titled "The Night of the Freebooters". Plans to produce 12 of these to assist in seizure of the Baja California lands, which would serve as home base for the arms merchant's army of "criminals, revolutionaries and desperate men"

Apparently in the course of things, prototype is used to destroy the creator's compound along with his fiendish plans. While not "steampunk" in the strictest sense, doesn't look out of place and my hat's off to Herb for this modelling!

With the next pair of pictures, a quiz for all of you: Where do you think this "P-45 Killer Bee" model is entered? S43 Hypothetical? S45 Miscellaneous? While in the same table vicinity, answer is NO. It's entry in S45 Dioramas



On the left is my shot, and on right, Uschi's take with a better clue where "killer" reputation comes from.

I have yet no clue if this is a model created from some other source or this was all the imaginative production of the entrant.

This catapult launch bird is a grand re-imagining of a Granville Bros Gee Bee air racer. Modeler really is commendable for efforts.

The "real" P-45 was what the Bell P-39C Airacobra's first designation was, just so you know.

Now, my two shots here taken at the time were to illustrate the "movie pose" on left and "birds eye" below. Now they can also illustrate again, problems of having things

in separate distinct categories which can be easily confused for those trying to judge them in events like this, when adjacently placed. Especially when compounded with as it happened here, your categories being misaligned with their category numbers.

As SVC 6 Head Judge, I was keenly aware in mid process that

we had some confusions in the upper numbered categories, the category signage in background of P-45 Killer Bee showing it perfectly. The Hypothetical Vehicles category was actually S43, not S44 which was actually Dioramas. The "Bv-38" shown here, the fictional flying wing aircraft from "Raiders of the Lost Ark" movie, was entered by modeler in S44 per his entry sheet, as the database recorded it. Most likely, the modeler intended this to be judged in Hypotheticals, not Dioramas, as not much of a story seen here. No idea if it got passed over in judging process or not, as I was busy judging and administering at the time. It was put next to entries for Junior Miscellaneous, the S43 Hypotheticals were next to Dioramas on other side (that signage was S45 crossed out with S44 handwrit), and with a "P-45 Killer Bee" actually intended to be in Dioramas, Judges would be excused if they had tried to get to bottom of where this was entered during the pressured process and couldn't. This engaging model would appear to have fit into any of the categories it was near. Having dealt with this issue first hand as Contest Director, Judge and contestant more than a few times, don't have any answers that stay put for sorting this out. Merely pointing it out here as it happened.



While still in Dioramas, this one caught both my eye (above) and Uschi's unbeknownst to me, her better take on the right. That is the BP "Defiant" day fighter which got a bad rap in



Battle of Britain for being deadlier to its crew than the enemy. Although not intended as a day fighter per se in first place, it was again a case of "not invented here" syndrome on top of asking it to perform other than design role. As RAF's No. 264 Squadron provided answers how to successfully employ Defiant in both bomber destroyer and day fighter missions with extensive experience trying them out from initial issue. Sadly, their officers were unable to get the HQ of next squadron to get the plane to take their sharing of lesson, and swiftly a deadly price was paid in air war.

Fortunately, re-deployment of Defiant as Night Fighter (Bomber Destroyer) combined with the knowledge gleaned by 264 Squadron, others, ended wartime tale of the Defiant on winning note: most night fighter kills in the 1940-41 Blitz.



Moving on to an area where Maria and I worked hard, not long after the pictures here shot.

On the left, sister has done a lively cohesive piece of a Polar Bear, just



stepping out from its cave after a wintering nap. On the right, brother has Dinosaur walking on water, it would seem. A third entry, "25 pdr gun" is barely visible in background of Dinosaur, all these in SJ4 SubJunior Miscellaneous, luckily roughly equivalent as "dioramas" so I could work on bringing Maria's learning focus as OJT judge on one broad point.

In the end, as you'll see in the Results Gallery at end of this issue, the First place went to the Polar Bear. Second to the Dinosaur, Third to the 25 pdr gun. From a purely technical viewpoint, the overall assembly finishing work would have put the Dinosaur and the 25 pdr gun in rivalry for 1st and 2nd, with perhaps the Dinosaur winning on simplicity because the extra figures, misc bits of the gun overall didn't match in quality, taken as a whole with the gun itself. But overall consistency in execution was the key factor in the end of why the Polar Bear was adjudged the best of three. Ignoring the "reality catch" factor which existed in all three, the scratchbuilt Bear was in a model that overall blended into one. The Dinosaur (a Spinosaurus, FYI) was itself well executed, perhaps in overall finish (paint, blending, weathered to be lifelike, etc) best of all. But then, trees, rocks, plant life overall, like in the 25 pdr gun entry, totally contrasted in work done in comparison to the Bear. Its prehistoric trees were on bases nakedly placed on a substrate, that rock work went from blended in to "dropped from the sky" look, as did the lichen bush work. Combined with that apparent "just put it here "stance of the Dinosaur, no effort made to merge the feet into the water at all, just dropped the viewer out of the whole piece. The 25 pdr gun entry has that same "weekend train set" set up look which doesn't jibe with rest of piece Yet cavern entrance and associated rock work blended to the base. In same coherent fashion as the consistent trees on the surfaces were made to seem as if they grew there, and the snow fell on them from sky, not provided out of the box. The Bear looks like it belongs there. So the mere untidy reality fact that (known to Maria and I first off) Polar Bears don't live in an area that has conifer trees, or rock formations as portrayed here, doesn't take anything away from the modeler's work here. In judgement of overall execution after judging on the basics of assembly, alignment, paint and finish, the work here is most consistent as compared to its competition and tips balance to its winning placement.

Before we leave my Junior & Youth category tales for this SVC 6 missive, I will share here 3 shots of models which were entered in those categories (J1, J3 & J4) and only by luck of my dear Uschi meeting the mom of the entrant, # 32, were they not kept there.

Earlier, on arriving, I had reviewed then current situation for all the Junior & SubJunior categories with Uschi and her Maria so I could relieve any anxiety over the process of Judging, which I'd asked Maria to undertake this year with me or another as mentor.

Since I have in past at

both local and Nationals shows seen and judged Junior models which were done by kids who could build this level, I merely remarked that these were likely winners in their categories, but not the norm for them. A little later, #32's mom was watching as Uschi was taking pics for me of the models and commented proudly of her son's first time entering model contest with them When she brought her son over, Uschi gathered he was over the Junior age limit, so then went, found me. Sadly, I was unable to convince mom & son

to simply move these into Senior category. They were too embarrassed, said had not realized how all of our categories set up. I hope they come through on a promise to return for our SVC 7, to compete

A lovely entry in 1/48th of America's first jet, YP-59.


