"GO FOURTH, REPEAT RUN WITH LOOK BACK AS WE GO ONWARD"







EDITOR Rambles On With Stats for SVC #3, Shares His Favorite Shots

STATS & SUCH FOR THIRD SILICON VALLEY CLASSIC 4/02/16

80 MODELERS ENTERED 265 Items (total 373 models on table, as <u>3 collections had additional 108 items</u> within "3 entry items")

(3 more modelers 14 less model entries than last year)

69 Senior, 7 Junior, 4 Subjunior class contestants in divisions (5 more Senior, 2 more Junior, 4 less SubJunior)

*Breakdown: Of original 48 Senior categories, ONE had no entries, with ONE split

Of original 5 Junior categories, NONE had NO entries with no splits required Of original 4 Youth categories, NONE had NO entries with no splits required

*Entries: 1 categories had NO entry, 1 in Senior

8 categories had only ONE entry (LOOK AT OUTCOME) 3 in Senior, 2 in Junior, 3 in Youth

8 categories had only TWO entries, 8 in Senior

With no split packages available atop the 57 categories we ended up using ONE (we had 1 potential due to 1 "no entry" category)

There you have it, the "official numbers" for Silicon Valley Classic # 3, showing a stable return on our investment. SVC Three ROUNDUP

With the Silicon Valley Classic #3 in the books, I can start the process all over again. With next years event and theme already in my head, I'm on the hook to follow through.

I will make it happen for the fourth event under my command.





Napredak Hall has done a series of improvements over the course of three years moving forward to better serve customers. The returning food truck was another plus in moving the Classic in a forward direction.

This year's contest was different for many, as it was the first year without the presence of model drive operators and regional fixtures Steve & Anita Travis. During my presidential term, I'd never thought I'd see something like this happen to the club membership, but things beyond our control happen.

Last year I was glad to see both Steve & Anita were able to attend but most of all for me pick the winner for the Subject of Honor award. I made this to honor the hard work they have done supporting the raffles, Lily's club, club auctions. But most importantly for the chapter of SVSM history they wrote, in giving back to the members of the United States armed forces through the model drive program. First thing in morning, when I was looking in the hall, I felt a large empty feeling and brought up memories from last year.



When the time came announce the "Subject of Honor" I asked Frank Beltran to say a few words about Steve & Anita, since he was the closest and he performed above and beyond what I could have done. The recipient was none other than Brad Chun with his trio of 32 Ford hot rods. Brad was floored to have won the award.

A bit of background on this year's award. I have the outlook of building something unique to fit with each yearly contest theme. Sure, I can go to a trophy store, buy something that's from a production line.But in my eyes that's the easy way out! I sponsored this out of my own pocket, built on my own time, with help from no one!

Clock's a Tick'n theme was incorporated into award design as the vertical section was shaped like some vintage hand of a clock. But if you look closely, there are three pieces that make up this section. The wooden background, the engraved aluminum a last minute addition of white colored plastic sandwiched between the two for some contrast. That plastic



was the best decision I made for the design, pulling everything together. Another hidden design was base plate shaped like a raffle ticket, since Steve & Anita donated some high priced items to the raffle to entice people to spend more on tickets. The award was made from walnut board I had bought at my local Home Depot last year, when I made first SA Travis Service award for Tri Cities 11.



What's in store for next year's design?

I'm " on the hook " for it and will not disappoint.
