Around this large hangar you can see lots of different items related to aircraft.



There are a couple of WW-I aircraft hanging from the ceiling, plus a few jets sitting in the back of the hangar.



Open door to the gift shop, walk in. Then pull out your "green backs" and/or a credit card, just go wild in the place.



The restrooms are on the left inside section of the hangar. There are other doors leading into another hangar where people work on aircraft.





Out on the tarmac, you will be able to walk up close to whatever aircraft is there. During the day you will be able to see military and non-military land, take off.

While I was at the show in 2011, the staff let any contestant go inside their restored B-17G.

I took several inside and outside photos of this, their B-17G named "Sentimental Journey." $\,$











As always, there is a vendor selling food & drinks. Due to the fact that model vendors, also including contestants, come early in the morning and stay until the show is over at 5:00p.m.

Any ways this is my 5th visit down to the show. I have always entered a few models and of course like Mick Burton said 20 years ago: "Here comes Rodney the Trophy Hunter." I have never disappointed Mick at contest.





So this year true to form I came home with some more trophies, which makes over 290 awards since I joined the San Jose club in 1984.



Some vendors have a small collection of items for sale, while others have more than 150 models and supplies to sell.

Sometimes prices are negotiable. Sometimes, vendors come into the show with prices marked down. All in all, you can get some good deals on models.

At age 84.5 I don't need any more models. But I bought an original "Monogram Dornier Arrow Do335 - Kit No 7538," which was wrapped in plastic, for only 20 bucks.

I opened up kit when I got home, finding it was made in 1974. The clear parts look like they were just made, the same for the decals. I have never made a "Do-335" so I'm looking forward to build of this kit.

During the awards ceremony they announced that this year was a banner year for Modelzona entries, being it was a bit over 500 models.

I got to meet some old friends and of course meet some new modelers. Enjoy the show! -fini RJW













Not just because that particular class of Armored Fighting Vehicle (AFV) are pretty abundant in the community as finished subjects, though that did help his optimism. Over the next few months, Editor Burton of course had to tweak it to expand range. After all, as November Club Cons are the final contests "in house" for the calendar year, wanted to give as many as possible chance to play in. Little did we both see just where this whole concept would finally end up, as one member cleverly "tracked down" new pathway

Say hello to Al Kuhn's "Tanks"

His "collection" entry (5 pieces) includes this one very humorously explained "early" vehicle. He had a short "live demo" underway before meeting started, this really ran off with speed/aim!



The finished "4 part tank" has "toothed running gear" which of course is a feature of any self respecting AFV from their very beginning, no?

Al gave us another "short track runout" during his excellent briefing on how in his own youth, made his own toys. Not letting meagre funding be any impediment to his enjoying life, even then. I'd dare say, perhaps this whole approach came in extremely handy during his years with the USA Space Program (including Apollo) while he was at Grumman.

Story about Al's 1/87th (HO) scale Mack Water Tanker brought new dimensions to the phrase "In Vino, Veritas" with a local legend in "Aigle" (known for its wine) being that certain varieties were enhanced by contents of these trucks. A Mack Water Truck for Wisconsin's Circus World Museum demonstrated, as Al pointed out, multiple purpose employ. The colorful schemes of the Circus vehicles would come in handy during the "main street parades" of old days shows, eye catching. As water truck during those was to "wash down" leavings of the elephants, horses in passage. Good job.



Ever the resourceful scale modeler, Al's Mack Fuel Tanker Trailer Truck came about when he had a left over "tank". As he'd taken truck for an earlier "crane truck conversion". Excellent editions for showing how else to "Get Tanked"



For the remainder of the now split into two parts, we had Ron Wergin's 1/72 Hasegawa (from oh so long ago!) British Churchill tank, mounted on a base to alleviate "wonky tracks". In center, Brian Sakai's British "Honey" in 1/72, then a Fujimi 1/72 Panzer I on the far right, above both is his 1/72 Japanese WW2 "Chi Ha", which I didn't record make of.

The AF-2/3 Guardian served (in pairing as "hunter/killer" teams, mostly) with the USN for several years until Tracker

S-2F (also Grumman) twin came on to replace them.

Amusingly, the same was true in their "civilian life" when Guardians had to be again taken out of service.

As "Fire Bombers", when ruled for "safety" no more single engine planes could "tank" retardant loads. So job went to "tanked" S-2s.

Mike's bird, now serving as prototype for his next in 1/48 scale version...maybe we'll have to "tank again"





- 7. ONCE UNWRAPPED, ALL GIFTS CONSIDERED "IN PLAY" UNTIL "DEAD". *NO TRADES !!* ARE ALLOWED IF IN PLAY ITEMS INVOLVED. Feel free to manage what you like with yours and others "dead"
- 8. UNWRAPPED GIFT IS "IN PLAY" UNTIL STOLEN THREE TIMES THEN IT IS DECLARED "DEAD" Any & all disputes for this declaration are resolved by Club Secretary or his designee, are final and binding. Just ask Chris B. or his designee.
- 9. PLAY ENDS when time to leave comes or all items are stolen to the dead point or the last one is unwrapped to its eventual fate.
- 10. AT LEAST ONE UNBUILT MODEL SHIP KIT must be present in the GIFT PILE. Or you're all in trouble.
- 11. AT LEAST ONE UNBUILT, HIGH QUALITY SCI FI MODEL must be present in GIFT PILE. (in Steve's Honor)
- 12. THIS MAY NOT BE COMPLETE RULES. LISTEN AT THE MEETING FOR ANY ADDENDA.
