BETTER LATE THAN NEVER, ESPECIALLY WITH GREAT STUFF WE HAD ON TABLE – Now, the minutes:

At the November meeting, we had news of our future meetings – namely, the December Christmas party/theft-fest, and the January auction (a great place for those theft-fest gifts that weren't just right to be put to good use!). We also got word on new contests – Fresno on Feb. 17, Sacramento on May 18, and our own on June 15!

In model talk...

Gabriel Lee is working hard to finish his 1:350 Yankee Modelworks *Balao*-class submarine as the U.S.S. *Sea Tiger* from the movie "Operation Petticoat." It's truly a movie model – the *Balao* class wasn't in service at the time the movie is set, but it's what the studio used for filming.





Bob Meyers had the better part of a large Panzer III collection done.





His Panzer III Ausf D came from the MiniArt kit, and its unreliable suspension was probably the reason for the special maintenance mark on the engine deck.



His Afrika Korps Panzer III Ausf J came from the Airfix kit, with Value Gear and spares box stowage added. He scratch-built the jerry can stowage rack.

Next was a Takom Panzer III Ausf M, built in markings for the Battle of Kursk.





His Panzer Ausf N was marked as a tank in Normandy, where it was used in support of the infantry.

Finally, he had a Tamiya Panzer III Ausf L, which was gray with an overspray of yellow typical of the transition period in German camouflage.





Amelia Bucholtz built Bandai's snap-together 1:2,700,000 scale Death Star II, then applied a wash and drybrushed the partially-finished station.

Chris Bucholtz has started painting on his Arma 1:72 P-51C, applying the yellow theatre ID bands and the red nose, tail and wingtips. These will all be masked ahead of the application of the natural metal finish.

Chris also spent considerable time adding the vacuformed tail gun position glazing to his Monogram 1:72 B-26-MA Marauder conversion; the tail has a Mini World .30-caliber gun sticking out of it, making it quite vulnerable until painting is done.







Mark Balderrama is building a model of a car he works on, an AE 86. He said the carbon fiber decal in the kit was a pain in the butt.

Frank Babbitt has Italeri's 1:72 Ju 86 in paint representing a Hungarian example. He lost a couple of parts for his kit, but found a donor for those parts at the meeting!





Cliff Kranz's Peterbilt 347 tractor came from Italeri, as did the 53-foot trailer he mated with it. He spraypainted the trailer, in contrast to the brush-painting he often employs.





Mike Meek's Hasegawa 1:48 P-51D has been modified into a racer, with the wing fillets removed and the wingtips shortened. He shot it with Tamiya lacquers for the red color, but intends to re-do the clear coat.









Ron Wergin's 1:72 Panther came from Plastic Soldier Co,; he says it's simplified but great for lazy modeling sessions. Ron may have needed it as a break from his lovely Hasegawa Churchill Mk I with a howitzer.





Ben Pada used MRP paints to finish off his Tamiya P-38F Lightning and to give some color to his Tamiya F4U-1D Corsair and Arma 1:48 Hurricane Mk. I.

He's still in the process of adding weathering to the Hurricane, which he says built up very quickly.



Chris Owczarek built Monogram's classic F4U-4 as a way to build up his skills. He added a pinwash over a final coat of Tamiya acrylics.



Greg Plummer finished the AMT Ford Bronco he entered to last month's orange and black contest; he says it has good fit but is a curbside kit. Greg also had a Porsche 908/3. A Japanese garage kit that had excellent resin parts, Greg said the kit was a little strange.









The 908/3 started as a hill-climbing racer and was adapted into a track racer with an eight-cylinder engine, taking first and second in the Targa Florio.





John Jew used the Dragon 1:35 kit to build an M4A3EA8 Jumbo, adding an Aber gun barrel and Fruimodel tracks and finishing it with Tamiya paints.



His Tamiya Willys Jeep was in his stash for 30 years before he built it and added some spare parts from other kits.



John also built a Tamiya CCKW 2 ¹/₂ ton truck, weathering it with layers of MIG pigments and filling the bed with oil drums from his spares box.





Mark Schynert found Fine Molds' 1:72 A7M1 Reppu to be obnoxious in its fit, but he battled it long enough to get it into a service-style paint scheme using Tamiya lacquers.

He says the Tamiya 1:72 Ki-61 isn't a bad kit, but it's been fighting him all the way. He keeps losing pieces – for instance, the intake for the DB601 fell off and had to be replaced by one from a Hasegawa kit. Mark has the Hien in natural metal paint and hopefully, the end is near.





Jack Riggar's Arma 1:48 Hurricane Mk. I received photoetched seat belts and a finish applied with Vallejo Model Air paints.



He said the decals in the kit were some of the best decals he's ever used!



Brian Geyer built his 1:28 Revell Sopwith Camel in 1973, and displayed it at the local hobby shop. A month later, he came into the shop and found the model broken! As a result, he created a diorama of a crashed Camel.



Model Mystery or Full Scale Cruel Hoax ?

These blurry photos, clearly taken by a cell phone, were recently passed on to the Editor ...

Not long after his having received a cryptic email with three textual attachments

what's going on here?



Come along now as he seeks to solve the puzzle he has decided to call:

"What Hath Wallis Wrought ?"

aka

Or, How Things Mid 20th Century Might Have Gone, Another Model Tale by Kent M. McClure

"A Very British Civil War" is a ruleset by Rob Jones, Steven Mortimer, and Simon Douglas (published by Solway Crafts and Miniatures) for gaming in an alternate universe in which a civil war broke out in England in the late 1930s.

According to them, Great Britain was plunged into a civil war in 1938. The culprit behind the civil war was none other than King Edward VIII. As the Prince of Wales, his conduct after WW1 caused some concern amongst both his father - King George V – and the then British prime minister Stanley Baldwin. This included the young prince's engaging in a number of sexual affairs. When George V died in 1936, Edward was elevated to King. But Edward showed impatience with court protocol and was causing consternation among politicians by his apparent disregard for established constitutional conventions. Note that Stanley Baldwin was the prime minister of a mainly conservative government. Things came to a head when Edward proposed to Wallis Simpson, an American who had divorced her first husband and was in the process of seeking her divorce from her current husband. Prime Minister Baldwin argued that a divorced woman with two living ex-husbands was politically and socially unacceptable as a prospective queen consort. Also, King Edward was the titular head of the Church of England. His marriage to Wallis Simpson would have brought Edward into conflict with church doctrine that disapproved of remarriage after a divorce if the former spouse was still alive. Had Edward not abdicated and pursued his marriage to Simpson, Baldwin and his conservative government most likely would have resigned, causing a general election to be held. Worse case scenario would be Edward dissolving parliament and appointing his own Prime Minister. Edward was a member of the British Union of Fascists, but did he have enough pull to form a government around that?

Anyway, I had acquired the Airfix Bren carrier through my usual back door methods (SVSM auctions, eBay, etc.) and it has been in my "bin for collecting dust" for years.



So, I thought that I would come up with something along the "VBCW" lines.







I remember seeing a set of "WW2 battlefield buildings" by Italeri that included a guard's shack and checkpoint gate. That got the ball rolling.

I knew that Zvezda had a set of hard plastic figures in their $1/72^{nd}$

range of wargaming figures. There was a British Tommy in the set I was looking at who was at attention and saluting. Just like you've seen in the movies. That figure was perfect for what I wanted. Then I remembered a figure of a woman that was basically in civilian dress carrying a rifle. She was from Caesar's WW2 Underground Resistance set. It was coming together. I envisioned in my mind how I wanted

the things laid out, including a torn "British Union of Fascists" poster.A quick trip to my local Michaels yielded a very nice base that I could use. I sketched the basic layout on the


plaque and envisioned where I wanted the elevation changes. Out came my trusty little tub of DAP DryDex Dry Time Indicator Spackling and I began to make the terrain. I dabbed at the roadbed while it was drying, trying to give it that "chunked up" look. To give that hill effect, I glued down some pieces of insulation foam to build up the hills first, then covered it with the spackle. While the spackle was still a little wet I added the track marks to show road usage, set the footprint for the guard shack, and added the location for the checkpoint stanchions.

The figures were cleaned up, given a bath in mild, soapy water and then painted with acrylics. The Bren driver and the girl had armbands painted on the upper arms to indicate the factions they belong to. The shadow effect was created by giving the figures a coat of Citadel Nuln Oil and then drybrushing the original colors. When dry, the entire groundwork was painted with artist's acrylics – a medium green for where the grass was going to go and a dark chocolate brown color for the road. When all that was dried 2mm static grass was spread on.


Finally, the road was given a dusting of AK Interactive Earth Effects and a final coat of dullcoat to seal everything in.




