
Desert Classic 2022


At the June meeting... we received a report on the long-delayed NNL event in Santa Clara. This year's event went really well and next year's event is already scheduled for January 21.

<u>In model talk</u>, See Young built Renwal's classic 1:32 Sky Sweeper anti-aircraft gun straight from the box. He liked the detail, but a lack of references convinced him to build it in travel mode.













Cliff Kranz used the MPC kit to build a Mack DM (Dump/Mixer), adding a fifth wheel from AMT to complete the tractor.

Cliff also completed a 1961 Ford, combining styling and custom pieces from an AMT kit and then brushpainting the model with two coats of Testors 28 green.







Cliff turned an AMT tanker truck that came with two left halves for the tank into a Kelsey-Hayes "centipede" tractor-trailer as used in Michigan.

He gave the Mack tractor a V8, then added a mess of tires from IMC kits to the eight-axle trailer. The tank itself was turned on its side and extended it vertically with styrene sourced from an old gas station promotional sign.





Ron Wergin finished the Airfix 1:72 Panther he had on the table last year, and he had a completed 1:72 Dragon Tiger I Initial type on the table to accompany it.



Ron also completed one of Pegasus' 1:72 Panzer 38t, which although it is intended for wargaming it has decent detail. All of Ron's tanks were crewed with Prieser figures.





Mark Balderrama is now the proud half-owner of a 3D printer, and he tried it out by making 1:288 models of the Convair Sea Dart and the Soviet experimental swept-forward flying wing Belyayev DB-LK.





Mark Schynert is building Tamiya's 1:72 Ki-61 Hien, and he says any issues with fit are mostly of his own doing.





He also saved a couple of models from his big kit purge for further work: a Heller Dewoitine 520 in Bulgarian markings and a resin Polikarpov I-17, which he's repairing.





Gabriel Lee's F-16A ADF conversion is based on a Hasegawa 1:72 kit with some Italeri parts; he's building it as a Puerto Rico Air National Guard aircraft in PRANG 50th Anniversary markings.





Kent McClure's collection of figures (for gaming, in some cases!) included a British officer in a cooking pot and several prehistoric post-dinosaur creatures (an elasmotherium, a phororacus, two American cheetahs and a lion). Kent also presented a tribute to PM Models with his Me 163A, Ho 229, Me 328, Me P.1111, and Lippisch P.13A.













Greg Plummer made an unconventional choice with his Hasegawa BMW 1967 2002; perhaps because of its sparse internal detail, he turned it into a rat rod, modifying the rear suspension. He took Revell's kit of the Volkswagen T2 bus and de-snap-togethered it, sealing the doors shut and adding AMG wheels plus a scratch-built cargo carrier for the roof. He says the model is too complex for kits, and too gimmicky for serious modelers, but the shape is accurate and some work clearly pays off.


























Chris Bucholtz has the green paint on his Aoshima 1:72 N1K2-J Shiden-Kai, and he's removed the masking on the yellow leading edges and the fuselage band, but he has yet to brush off the salt masking on this very work plane.



Chris is also starting work on an Eduard 1:72 DH.2, which shocked him by being so small — "an ultralight with a machine gun!"



Mariah's DaVinci tank was built from the Minicraft kit; Mike Burton dubbed it "the Roomba of Death."



(below) This is Mariah's fully assembled, full length version of Da Vinci's assault bridge. Chris's minutes did not include it. As this model convincingly displays the "defensive posture" of the design if one attempts moving in any way it doesn't like: i.e; it explodes into component parts in microsecond. She had displayed at Editor's Haunt in front earlier, and not on model tables...(So the Editor is framing it in here, now)





Pat Nichols used a resin canvas top for his Skybow/AFV Club WC-50 command car, and used MiniArt's "U.S. Officers" set to depict a meeting with Ge. George Patton in Sicily


Pat also applied his attention to another former Skybow kit, the WC-52 weapons carrier, and hitched a 55mm anti-tank gun to it from Riich Models. Pat said the gun broke down into many, many small parts – almost like the original! More MiniArt figures were used to enhance the scene, these troops in relaxed poses.























Bob Meyers built Trumpeter's KV-1 as a captured German Buetepanzer, swapping in a gun from a Panzer IV and adding a new German-style cupola for the tank commander. He scratch-built a cargo rack for the rear of the vehicle and added stowage and a Jerry can rack.
