At the May meeting... Randy Ray reported that the (SVSM Club Official) website's galleries are being moved so they can be managed better.


The software we were using is 20 years old, and the updated solution will save money and provide a better viewing experience, especially for mobile devices.

Chris Bucholtz reported that the Spirit of '45 event in San Jose is back on, with the swing dance moved to Saturday night (it had been Friday nights) on the August 15, so the entire event is encapsulated on one day.

This event is held annually at the San Jose Historical Park and features re-enactors (both

In model talk... **Cliff Kranz's** 20th V-2 model depicts an example test-fired a year to the day before his birthday in 1948.







He based the Kinetic F-84F wings with a straight-wing fuselage to create a 1:48 prototype swept-wing





Thunderjet, and he also made a Monogram F-84E to replicate one he saw in a photo taken at Edwards Air Force Base used for trials with 24 rockets beneath the wings, mounted on home-made H-shaped rails.





(above) This is Cliff's F-84F in 1/48th, from the Monogram kit. He had it along as reference to his other Republic Thunders, it was not noted in the minutes... (So the Editor is framing it in)

Frank Babbitt's working on a Hasegawa 1:48 F-16A in Venezuelan colors, which he points out may look like USAF SEA camouflage but which are their own shades. He used Aires wheel wells and Seamless Suckers intakes, which caused a conflict that needed a lot of sanding to resolve.





Ron Wergin brought a trio of 1:72 Panthers, two with the Daimler Benz "schmallturm" turret.





The third was a combination of the Dragon and Hasegawa kits. Ron found that the Airfix Panthers' tracks were too short – forcing him to use side skirts to hide their shortcomings.





See Young liked the simple working suspension in early issues of Renwal's M41 Walker Bulldog; he built the old 1:32 kit and pointed out that this version of the M41 isn't available in 1:35.





Mark Balderrama folded up paper model in small scale of an F8F Bearcat in Blue Angels markings, and won an award for it at the *Hornet* contest. He's also folded up a photoetched model of a Ford Mustang from the Rare Earth kit.





Landon Carr liked Bandai's First Order AT-RT walker, which snapped together neatly. That speed enabled Landon to get to paint quickly!





John Carr is working on some reclamation projects, starting with a pair of Space Cruiser Yamatos a coworker gave him. He stripped the paint off both and is modifying one to his own liking before re-painting it.

John also obtained an assembled *Buck Rogers* starfighter and plans to strip it and re-assemble it to a higher standard.






Kent McClure had a parade of small figures, which included a Glyptodont, a number of futuristic cars, bookcases, kiosks, and multiple figures for what may be the craziest role playing game ever.









Ken Miller had two built examples of Monogram's "Orient Express" 1:144 blended-wing SST airliner. The first kit's decals self destructed so Ken finished it in Lufthansa colors; he's going to try to use the kit decals on his second example.



His small-scale Entex 727 was completed in PSA livery with Vintage Flyer decals, although they provided him with an excessive number of windows!





His Airfix DC-9 is assembled, but he says it took an excessive amount of putty to disguise all the seams.

Ken also used some spare 1:72 Airfix lunar rovers and astronauts to create a diorama depicting a real space race, complete with a checkered flag.





Mike Meek is building Tamiya's 1:48 model of the P-51D "Ridge Runner III" in its Reno racing configuration; he robbed a High Planes kit for the racing wingtips and scratch-built the wing root fairings and the extended radiator door.



Mike had reference material for these because his sole proprietorship business fabricated the modifications for the real airplane!



Greg Plummer had a 1:48 Mustang of his own, this one from Airfix; his was an F-51 flown by Haiti in its mid-1960s colors of overall gray with a narrow black anti-glare panel.





Greg received the model in last year's gift exchange – he says the detail is a bit heavy but it assembles very well.

To build the Haitian Mustang, he used Aztec decals and added external tanks from an F-86 Sabre.

Greg also built Bandai's kit of the Science Patrol's S-16 miniature submarine, seen in the very first episode of *Ultraman* – Hayata saves himself when the sub is hurled from a lake by a monster by using the Beta Capsule.





Chris Bucholtz painted up an assortment of Hornet heads for Wehrmacht tank troops for a pair of SdKfz 232s he's working on, using oils for flesh tones and drafting pens for the eyes. For one of the dioramas, he's also build a camel from a MasterBox set, painting the saddle using a mix of paints, pens and masks to replicate a Baktyar rug pattern.





Chris also finished up the bottom of his Aoshima 1:72 N1K2-J Shiden-Kai with a mix of Testors Metallizer paints and a custom mix of gray and metal for the fabric control surfaces.

No matter, I shall do best I can (3).






He has advanced this build quite a bit since I last have seen it, and I don't recall the complete extent of mods he has done so far. This is a very very accurate and for its time especially, an exceptional snap tite that does rival "glue kit contemparies" even some today. Surely when Chris finishes this, a kit will come out for same.



Geoff Krueger likes ICM's 1:48 OV-10A Bronco, and says all the complications in the build owe to the plane's unconventional layout, He added wiring to the cockpit along with Quinta 3D-decal instruments, and completed the model as a Marine Bronco with Caracal decals.



He says the model's main weakness is the landing gear, which is to scale and as a result can be a little wobbly.



Geoff also completed Classic Airframes TA-4J Skyhawk, which he says takes a lot of work. To its credit, it



gets the leading-edge slat track correct. Geoff used Eduard detail parts for the cockpit and the flap interiors, plus pilot figures borrowed from Hasegawa.

Karsten Krueger's McClaren GBR in 1:24. The device beside it? As he demo'd, is a steering mechanism





Pat Nichols Academy 1:35 M12 155mm Motor Gun Carriage represents one on only about 100 built; these WWI-eras French guns found their place in the reduction of the Siegfried Line because they were great at

direct fire against bunker targets.



Pat used Eduard brass for the many grills and gave the model a MasterBox crew, topped with resin heads from Hornet.



Laramie Wright has a number of projects in the works, starting with a Dragon 1:35 Brumbar 15cm gun, depicted in its late guise.





He has a 1:35 Panzer IIIN from Tamiya well underway, and has plans to finish it as a vehicle used at Stalingrad.



Furthest along is a painted CM11 Taiwanese tank, fashioned from parts from Tamiya and AFV Club. The tank used an M60 hull and an M48 turret mounting a 155mm gun; he painted the model with Tamiya paints in a three-tone camouflage pattern.

And the model of the month went to... **Cliff Kranz's** F-84E, built from the Monogram kit to depict a test article fitted with 32 rockets at Edwards Air Force Base for trials, featuring rocket racks Cliff made from scratch, tied with **Karsten Krueger's** McClaren GBR in 1:24, a brick-style construction kit that went together like Lego.
