


REGION 9 1986 CONTEST











Top to bottom Lockheed RC-121D/EC-121D Constellation, EC-121H, and NC-121K Warning Star

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Entry Fees: \$2.00 per person. Model Fees: \$1.00 per each model.

Trophies: Senior Division- Trophies for 1st; 2nd; & 3rd; place, with Honorable Mention.

Junior Division: Trophies for 1st place. Ribbons for 2nd, 3rd, & Honorable Mention. And a "special ribbon" for all junior entries.

Aircraft: B-45; B-50; B-25; B-29; B-17; A-26, Corsair; Mustang (P-51 & twin Mustang); Skyraider; P-38(photo recon); F-80; F-84; F-86; F-94; Sea Fury; Navy Spitfire(counter rotating prop); AT-6 Texan; C-47; C-46. Ilyusain- IL-10 Stermovic; Mig-15; Yak-9 and/or 11; and P0-2 bi-plane bomber, etc.

<u>Ships</u>: Iowa Class Battleships- "BB-61 to 64; Several Essex Class Aircraft Carriers - "CV-9, 10, 21, 31, 34, 36, 39, 45 and 47.

<u>Vehicles</u>: Jeep, Large and small trucks, Sherman and Patton Tanks, Halftarcks and others.

OUT OF THE BOX CATEGORY: We will follow IPMS/USA rules.

OTHER CONTEST RULES: You may enter your model in the "Korean Conflict Theme," or you may enter it into the regular categories, but you can not enter it in "both." If at all possible, bring documentation for your model, if you enter it into the Korean Conflict Theme.

This event is open to "ALL" modelers, members and non-members alike.

REMEMBER: Bob Love's aircraft was named "BERNIE'S BO", BU-12769/FU-769. It was a F-86 Sabre Jet. Again, he was stationed with the 335th; Fighter Squardron-4th Fighter Interceptor Wing. His unit insignia, an Indian Head, within a circle can be found on Microscale Decal sheets; 72-144; 48-52 and 32-22.
