
"Two In ONE NIGHT Club Contests? UNHEARD OF ... "

So arriving right at 7 PM room open to greet a potential new member, he was so pleasantly challenged also, keeping up our table space for arriving entries! By the way, those splendid contest signs are the brilliant product of President Plummer.

Took longer than I desired to finally wrap this issue up as truly complete, and most of the angst was this portion of this page. Arrived at an acceptable method finally to explicate one thorny component (Annual Shows Conduction Theory in Practice). While also booking another leg on "Walking Distance" (truly one of the best Serling produced Twilight Zone works ever) in the passage to penning here.

Okay, so here's the deal: 2023 marks the 60th continuous year of operations for this outfit (not Chapter, that anniversary is next year), it also happens to be my 40th continuous year as a Member In more or less Good Standing. As it happens, it's also the my sweet 16th year in serial terms as Editor for outfit. All that is well and good in its own small way, but within that span are things that speak to the larger picture of "why and why not" do we do, have this, that or another "in works, or worked on, or back in action, or no longer will do such and such". Literally, answer is in inertia of A Contest of Will. While popularly used in one of its primary definitions, inertia actually has two states, static (the popular one) as opposed to dynamic. Using it in the truest form as in physics is more instructive to what I am trying to illustrate here re: Contests specifically, and our operations so far to date over this August span of 6 plus decades and counting. Namely, inertia being the property of a body (or organization, or person, etc) to resist anything that would cause a change in its state of motion. effectively opposing any acceleration forces applied, whether at rest (static inertia) or in motion (dynamic inertia.). We on the E-Board have been asked several times over the past several months by various folks in various ways, when is the next SV Classic being held (expecting it to occur in 2023 of course). We have made it clear there won't be one in 2023 when it became clear to us who comprised the initial exploration committee as noted in the October 2022 Election results, (President, 2nd VP, Treasurer). That we ourselves had no possible way to reasonably take up all required acceleration force, by the end of the first quarter of 2023. We also knew then that unless someone truly had "that fire in the belly, that Will to See It Happen", that irresisitible DYNAMIC inertia, to step in, step up, get her done, that inevitably, static inertia occurs.

We were incredibly lucky in my estimate among others who shared same sentiment, that we had **Mike Woolson** for the 9 years and 7 SV Classics that he with his team each time, when he took up SV Contest Direction from me (after I had took it on for a while from others with my teams) As he had to have an Unstoppable Will to See This Through, to carry the last one off after 4 cancellations over many months. That's the true Contest of Will that makes this stuff happen, like this Club making over sixty years of existence. Yes, I've held many posts (all of them, actually) in my 4 decades, but I owe a great debt to one William Ferrante, our Treasurer, who has been AT THAT POST FOR 30 YEARS NOW and has still the Will to go on. One huge contribution to why Mike W, myself for two, were able to carry off events we directed or continue to enjoy the benefits of having a model club to be part of, because someone like him carries on rain or shine. William and I had done "annual contests" in our past, before my first time ever as President of club. My less than stellar partnering left him pretty much not ever wanting to to be stuck in that boat again. Yet he took up Treasurer when I asked him to for me 30 years ago as 1st time Prez. He continues keeping true faith of our community's cohesion for all of us. Right now, our next Contest Director has to 1) find our new venue and contract it (the Napredak required an immediate commit from us in no later than October 2022 with a non refundable deposit, with a looming 5K rental fee for a start, so like Mike W when faced with similar situation at end of my 2013 SC Convention Center show, we said, no thank you) 2) Has to quickly as well secure a date not already in play or taken for 2024, and get it approved by Region Nine RC.

- 3) Have some idea who he/she can depend on to get Awards, Raffle Items, Vital Paperwork, Promotion Efforts, Vendor Outreach/Management underway pretty much simultaneously now 4) Come up with a theme suitable for our 60th year as a Chapter to go with all this. 5) Have some idea of when they will want to hand off the reins and whom to, or find that we again will quickly enough exhaust their Will to Contest and also have us return swiftly to a state of static inertia. Trust that Greg (President, Again!) William (Treasurer forever and VP, Prez, CD, Editor before too) and me can attest YOU have to WANT TO DO THIS WITH TRUE PASSIONATE ENERGY or, it just will not...happen. See you in October -fini mickb

When Greg came up with this fiendish pair of themes early in year, I had hopes to be able to have entries so at least one entrant of each. Wondrously we had a fine turnout, as you will soon read.

First: Quick review of the stated rules here:

"B.B.B."

Which simply translates when expanded: Build Back Better Subjects

Simple Rules:

The finished TWO models must be same scale and of same subject representative throughout

One must be an early build or a crude kit, the Other must be one you have done better



" M.A.G.A. "

Which simply translates when expanded: Make America Great Again Subjects
Simple Rules:

Finished model representative through & through, of an AMERICAN origin:

American Kit, American Subject & Markings, MUST HAVE ALL THREE - Testors Paint prefer



With the shot above to better illustrate the separate contests, we'll start with the American subject focus, with a pleasing variety of subjects and four entrants, eight entries.

Greg Plummer has good things to report about his build of recent Atlantis Models reissue of the Boeing Model 2707 in 1/400th scale. Originally molded by Monogram Models in 1968, one rerelease in 1973, this swing wing SST was destined to only be ever a model. Greg finished his in kit speculative Pan Am scheme. As he pointed out, the tail colors reverse of those ever used by that airline, however they are very attractive in that. 14 parts in all, plus 3 part stand, lovely fast model





Greg brought this swiftly crafted little jewel as the second of his two entries.

The tale of how the first one of his went in being built, well matched a masterful finished product, and I wish I could have recorded it for here.

Quintessentially American, the International Harvester company's Model 1466 farm tractor became a 1973 issued 1/25th "Blueprinter Kit" from Ertl Co. of Dyersville Iowa

As Greg relayed, as lovely as this kit is, never rereleased or reissued, now very rare and a pricey kit. I am glad he built it









Looks every inch a living, breathing, working Farm Tractor, no? At 130 parts, nearly ten times the count of the SST! Up next, with only her fourth completed scale model, **Eugenie Ray** with her Lockheed SR-71A in 1/72 by Monogram





Eugenie impressively dealt with the "problem" of how do you make something "all black" look interesting and real. As you see, she captured with airbrushed grey washes artfully applied using post it note masks, exactly her goal. Great work in the cockpit, splendid delicate temporary adhesion of the canopies protected it all as she applied base finish & washes.






Mark Schynert found this contest a perfect answer to moving this auto project from his Shelf of Doom. He also brought his triple threat entry, the Northrop Gamma aircraft tripoley in 1/72nd scale. First though, a look at literally, his first car!

This 1968 Dodge Dart GT was converted by him from a Revell GTS kit, and started out simply enough. However, things like having to remove the hood scoops made for quite an adventure. Sanding through the hood in doing this required some plastic surgery magic. Mark's real Dart also had a slant 6, so he had to obtain a resin conversion engine to fit into his here


He also had to re-engineer the exhaust system to be a single pipe, as was case with his first car. Finally, Mark had to come up with custom color mix, luckily he found MCW Paints had his answer. His front bumper rudely came off on way to gig.

All American products in every way, and one more entry to go.





Chris Bucholtz recently completed this Muroc Models resin kit of the NASA Ames/Dryden research facility design partnership with the American designer Burt Rutan, the AD-1. Created to test concept of the Oblique Wing for possible employment in future airliners, while a success in proving the viability, no one has gone on to utilize the idea.

Again, all American model in equally steeped markings.

So, now you have all the MAGA Club Contestants and entries, we will now have a review of the BBB Club Contestants and models, at end of this I'll give you the results of all this fun.



So as seen below, the Build Back Better competition company, many models as you had to have two per for entry. Two of the visible models in the right rear, were in fact intended to be entrants, but alas, ended up not being so. The grey and green twin engine Bristol Beaufighters, just so you know, which will be covered in July Meeting article in August OSS.

Seven entries from five entrants, this time an all aircraft event.





Ron Wergin did us right in total spirit of the BBB contest; with this pair. In 1/72, two Supermarine Spitfires, 25 years apart! Revell "way back when" kit on the left first, and on right, his "better", the lovely recent Airfix rendered by Ron

Cliff Kranz as well, his orange tailed Monogram 1958 original issue F-105 Thunderchief held up pretty well for him. He paired it with 2023 *build of the same kit* done this time in TAC camouflage. Quite a feat in itself, wouldn't you say?







Cliff also brought along two Lindberg $1/48^{th}$ "Navy Fighter" (aka F6F Hellcat), one on right is from 1955 and done by Mr Kranz. The left one is a 2023 build of the same kit, by Cliff (Mr Kranz reference is to Cliff's dad) Model history!







Greg Plummer also made supreme effort to have entries for this contest as well. His 1/72nd scale MiG-15UTI by Hobby Boss in Ugandan Air Force camo scheme, was done 6 or 7 years ago. His "Better" bird, on the right, a beautiful upgrade of the two seat MiG trainer in form of the Eduard "Profipak" edition, choosing an Indonesian Air Force nat metal scheme

Greg pointed out many details that were better rendered by Eduard and really make the kit a winner. Sorry I did not get my notes for all the great features and comparisons for both kits, but I tried to get shots to impart what we saw in person. If I recall correctly, the black tail paint is the gloss black undercoat for his spray metal finish, masked for later use here.





Bill Ferrante went into this also with great effort in keeping with Greg's challenge here.

One could say he brought a pair of "mules" to the party. No slight here, that's really the translation of Czech nickname "Mezek" for this aircraft.

The light blue $1/72^{nd}$ scale AVIA S.199 is a KP Models kit he did in 1985, done as an IDF/AF fighter from the 1948 war.



Bill's "Better" S.199 was from KP but not the same molding as his original

He had much good to say about newer edition molding and kit. A look at the photos should give you an idea how the KP kit was improved between editions. The landing gear door, like bumper of Mark Schynert's Dart GT, saw fit to break off while at the contest. It's life.

Done again in IDF/AF colors but in the tannish green scheme this time, a beautiful result of an aircraft called as deadly to its pilots as to the enemy. Now up, two USN Grumman WildCats from **Chris Bucholtz.**

Both in 1/72, and built ten years apart. He said it's about time for him to start another one, as # 2, blue bird dates back near decade





Chris's second, "better" build was done in 2002 from the Hasegawa kit.

He did his in markings of Thomas Cheek, from VF-3 "Fighting Three" who had quite a storied career. He was at the Battle of Midway, 1942 to be eyewitness to all three carriers *Akagi, Kaga, Soryu* of the Imperial Japanese Navy being mortally hit by USN dive bombers, all three sinking by next day, June 6.

Below is Chris's first Wildcat, in prewar scheme, using the Academy kit

Last up with be another USN pair, this time in 1/48th scale. Then we will find out the winners. Read on!





Geoff Kreoger brought 3 1/48th scale F-4 Phantom IIs, the "Black Bunny" being a Monogram he did in 2016, but not actually part of the contest, he said. His two overall grey late service USMC and Navy birds were his true entrants, first one being the VMFA-333 F-4S, from the Academy kit, seen below.

Above, the amazing F-4S from Zoukei Mura, which Geoff chose to do in the scheme of the last operational USN carrier squadron (VF-151) to launch off the USS Midway in 1986. He said this kit was worth all the effort building, it's "better"


