






A surfeit of recent matters to cover in short order tests the Editor's mettle, nice problem to have in its own way, read on, hey?

Having been challenged to craft some "cross club meeting contests" not so long ago, this Editor (also serving President for time being with the Fremont Hornets) devised some experiments for 2023. One of them here, gave him a chance to riff on a tried and true classic theme. One SVSM has done before (thus the "Deux" definition) and open the possible entrances for friendly competition also. So second Friday in June, Fremont Hornets had their first official "**D**-Day Club Contest". Following Friday, SVSM "**D**-Day Deux" Club contest ensued. Participation in both was encouraged, and happily enough a couple of folks did just that, and at the MPD Community Room, here's how the last half of the tale unfolded forthwith:





Bill Ferrante came through with a fine 1/72nd **D**eHavilland Mosquito NF.11 for his twin engine prop entry. Very nice.

Bill's definitely "cross club" entry was next. His **D**ouglas A-4 Skyhawk in 1/72nd, in IDF/AF scheme, so to neatly solve a 28 year old problem. This model was one he'd drew the hard luck lot on. For the Fremont "A-4 Nationals Project" which never got to the IPMS Nats, thanks to bailout of the project leader in following through on the transportation of the group's effort. Bill

had never found an Indonesian AF decal set to complete this rare Skyhawk then or now. But inspired he said, by "**D**-Day" club contest, he finished his "Shelf of Doom" **D**ouglas A-4E in scheme which predated its Indonesian service. Completed with extended tailpipe he had so carefully made for this representation so long ago in good faith, for that Nationals effort.

Bob Meyers showed up with his recent completions, one being this Panzer IV ausf \mathbf{D} in $1/35^{th}$ from Tamiya, below:





how he achieved the "winter finish" on his Pzr IV ausf **D** too.

Cliff Kranz didn't "Dodge" a chance to participate in this either. He had this Charger street machine in vibrant hues, well in the thick of things.

Bob was a catalytic proponent of the cross club contest concept and did a grand job of supporting it here.

His M-42 "Duster" twin 40mm AA gun on left, was the old Tamiya 1/35 kit done specifically for contest, as was his Panzer.

Bob's signature subtle "aging & weathering" was in full effect with both entries and he gave a great explanation of











Laramie Wright didn't miss a trick or this club contest, with a trio of terror! His Firefly Vc "Carole", decked out in full June 6, 1944 Normandy **D**-Day equipment, including the special "amphibious landing exhaust housing" on rear. Dare I say his tank commander looks delighted to be doing his part to compete here? Next to it, his **D**reidecker pair.





In 1/35th scale, I believe it is the DML kitting of this fine member of the Sherman tank family, a subject near and dear to Laramie to be sure. Well done model and well in the classic tradition of "D-Day" themed contests, glad to have this here

Below, the aforementioned pair of his **D**reideckers (three wings) in 1/72nd scale. The all red **D**r.**I** is a Revell kitting, which he said has a far superior method of engineering the wing assembly in compare to his Roden kit build in the streaky green While the scheme he chose to make that other little Fokker makes the official aircraft designation F.1, it's still **D**reidecker as constructed. A clear qualifier for entry which was pointed out during model talk when this was brought up. So there!





Gabriel Lee didn't space out on this club contest, he definitely had his D's in a row here. His ASUKA craft is designated within its own world context, as a DAOE-01, which he helpfully included reference material for the fact with his entry.






I am better apprised especially these days, thanks to Gabriel Lee, Cliff Kranz and Kent McClure for my primary three, that I have even an idea just how much is out there of this genre for modelers. Okay, off soap box for now, here's Gabriel with his unfinished ST-NG NCC-1701-**D** Enterprise. One kit that he has some choice "D" words for

This is the combat supply ship that is on the right side of the Yamato, in the series "Space Battleship Yamato 2205 New Departure". Which in the North American markets is more often known in short hand as "Starblazers 2205"

There is a much larger audience than the IPMS USA community at least in part, may realize for these types of models, thank you Gabriel for this.

Barely seen in the earlier "field of battle" pictures, so now as an aide, my scrap view cutout shot showing all three "under the gun" so to speak, Mark Balderrama with his "Three D" entries getting in "just under the gun" (he had to come from work and had just enough time to put them into play as it was)

While I am not familiar with details of the kits, I believe they are all from a splendid variety series scaled in 1/144th, Mark's favored scale for aerospace subjects.





First up, in this dazzling prewar scheme, **D**ouglas TBD-1 **D**evastator Dive bomber/Torpedo launcher.

This yellow wing, red tailed, nosed, striped look is probably most well known for this particular aircraft.

Monogram Models first did the TBD justice in 1/48th injection mass market release back in the '70s with this in a squadron VT-2 "yellow tail" schema.

Mark's 1/144th is VT-5 resplendent.

Next up, in the scheme that is more along lines that the TBD-1 saw combat during early part of USA Pacific campaign. The blue with gray undersides and the striped tail.


Oh, not nearly as flashy of course, but still an improved look if you know what was in between, a "Neutrality Grey" scheme, yeesh.





Thanks to Mark's entry here, I had to research, find out this scheme was applied to TBD-1s that were used as Advanced Trainers from 29 October 1942 to 31 December 1943 at NAS Miami. I love the tricolor schema. The red outline star and bar is also a fairly rare occurrence, so this on a 1/48th TBD-1 for me would be a welcome treat to try. Now I know of it!

Okay, now closing out the "D-Day Deux" attendance with two "display only" entries by prolific Mr. Ben Pada Jr.

Ben's support of the contest theme was mightily appreciated, even more by the Judge (me) as he generously went with his own offer to have as Display Only.

He asked and was assured he was on target, "D-Day" stripes schema were perfectly legitimate qualifiers for any one who wished to enter the contest.

The Hawker Tempest Mk V is a damned big and aggressive looking machine. Combined with "D-Day" invasion stripes, it's very attractive to my eye, and I hope some also agree

Both of these builds by Ben are again so mighty competitive, pleasing to have them as Displays.

His modelling aide choice, these multipose multi purpose "third and fourth hands" tool rigs, also get my vote as great value for \$\$.

Thank you Ben and everyone else who took me up my "D"- lineation Club Contest.







1950's Swedish Camouflage Secret Revealed

Shown here is Bill Dye's model of the Saab Tunnan on its rarely modeled camouflage disk. The history behind the disk is as follows. In the 1950's, the UN sought a fighter that could be successfully employed anywhere, anytime . Clearly, no single camouflage paint scheme would be suitable. Saab engineers came up with the idea for a "Tørnschøbe" or camouflage disk. The camouflage disk was produced on the cover name of "Tørnfrisbee." The disk was low cost, light weight and could be self-deployed by the associated fighter. Each Tunnan carried 10 disks into the theatre of operations. The disks would then be distributed (no closer than 500 meters to one another) about the airfields from which the airplane was to operate. The aircraft camouflage was so carefully matched to the disk that from an attacking aircraft, it was impossible to tell if a Tunnan was "øuf de schøbe" (literally translated, "on the pot") or not. This clever scheme presented any attacker with an overwhelming number of potential targets, only 10% of which would be genuine. Unfortunately, the concept was never truly tested in combat during the Tunnan's operational career.▲



Bill's model was based on a previously classified and rare Swedish Military Intelligence photo showing a Tunnan on its "Tørnfrisbee." Normally the UN markings would not have been carried. The aircraft is slightly misaligned on its camo-disk to permit it be recognized; if perfectly aligned, only the disk would be visible.
