Third edition of **The A**fter**M**arket **S**heet (TAMS) for 2023, again done in addition to the Original Styrene Sheet. Which got published in plenty of time as I prefer to do, however sorely short of space to get timely coverage of all I wished to.

Yet to have more to publish than time or space to do so, is a splendid editorial "problem" to have, and considering as I noted in the first TAMS of 2023 (Feb/Mar), that although this is 11<sup>th</sup> year of calendar for TAMS, there was an entire year 2021 that saw none crafted or published. The OSS also saw a year of absence, however it was neatly tucked into brackets of ceasing post July 2020, a resumption at July 2021, so wasn't quite as clearcut (trust me it was noticed though, seems I nearly had to join Mark Twain, a few others in correcting erroneous reports of my possibly passing... Sorry no such luck)

Part of the fun (and yes it can be like modelling and other aspects of life, frustrating fun at times) of putting together news letter vehicles like this is the chance to find room, material for this, the Editorial page. Not always in them, or very hefty if they are, but I do try to manage one and aim to make them model related. Yes, plenty of repetitive themes in them hardly a point in arguing that point. But quite often enough, worth repeating or revisiting, and I'm going to re-introduce three of my favorites as rant & roll (or role) here, to vibe from one I just did for my other club publication, the Hornets Buzz V.1 Implied or not, intent is to keep stimulus or act as catalyst, therapeutic and remind all last word is rarely that or ought be.

SWEEPS – While at the IPMS USA Nationals level it was decided in favor of "No Sweeps" quite a while back, it's been left to the Regions and Chapters to decide case by case for themselves what "award sweeping" policy should be in place. In Region Nine, we seem to have managed for quite awhile to have become a "SWEEPS STATE" with those shows that have been hosted. However, it's not always been so. Having caught up too late with his nifty President's Blotter, I was sad not to be able to respond with an editorial or two to IPMS Santa Rosa, although a firm adherent to allowing Sweeps myself, I would have bet the fact Dev and his crew were offering a new show first up in the year would have gotten as grand a response as they did, No Sweeps or Sweeps regardless. Mayhaps another group will boldly go that way in future. Having kept up so many contest records for a goodly long time, plus being at/judging a fair amount of different shows, more often than you might know same person will sweep alright, because they were the only entrant! Oh yes, sometimes in a very few categories, dominant one or few will "shut out" others. Nonetheless, pursuing No Sweeps isn't a deadly sin

**JUDGING** (or not) – We had a welcome resurgence of having not only enough Judges, but enough of a mix of new and Experienced, that Head Judge Chris Bucholtz was able to pretty smoothly carry off getting things done for Santa Rosa in their Return of the Model Show. Still, it behooves me to remind that Judging not only helps the show and the contestants, it sharpens up your modelling skill pretty damned well in shorter order than many other means. It also helps leaven one's tongue in critiques at times in future after being in those shoes, and often easy then to spot someone who's never done it but has all sorts of righteous fire about how someone else has done it so clearly wrongly... Also, you will possibly learn to judge all sorts of models, not just the ones you're most comfortable doing, and find many common grounds, even perhaps new application or technique in the process of discussing the models you're assessing, with the others you work with.

**NEWSLETTERS** (or not) – Right now, in our Region, I know we have at least THREE active pubs going on between SVSM, Fremont Hornets and IPMS Monterey Bay. That seems to be our historical average over last 20 or so. Just know that in the past I have written of (and read others who wrote virtually the same before and after me, even within our own past Editors) the fact that more often if you have a newsletter or similar vehicle, even if it's not a monthly, your club has a tendency to hang together or on in times lean and mean as well as vibrant. Like when no meeting places can be had or a bloody national emergency blows up your whole existence for an indeterminate period or several. So don't be shy, the social media won't disappear if you commit to putting something together to share in an "old fashioned newsletter". But you might end up as a Guest Editorialist, so watch out! You might find you like it and do it again. -fini mickb






