

I have used "fusion" technique to blend existing minutes with my own notes and photos. In order to better illustrate all that went at the busy opening of "regular" SVSM meetings for year -mb


Our club contest was F for February, and we had a lot of entries.



**Ben Pada**'s FG-1 Corsair came from the Tamiya kit, and wears Salvadoran markings from the "Football War."



**Bob Meyers**' Sherman Firefly started as a Tasca/Asuka kit, and he built it expressly for this contest. One of the idiosyncrasies of the Firefly that Bob pointed out was the lack of a bow gun.





**Dave Balderrama** dug out a Huma 1:72 FW Triebflugel kit he had started in 1993. He needed lots of shims to get it centered so the rotor could spin.





Dave also nudged in this "F is for Fire Truck" entry, however I didn't get any specifics beyond that noted...-mb

**Thanh Nguyen** has a Hobbycraft F8F Bearcat under construction, which he's building out of the box with the exception of new seat belts and has given a coat of ModelMaster non-buffing-aluminum.







Mark Balderrama's JRM Mars in 1:144 was created using an F-Cutter - it's big and blue, but still under construction. OKAY- the rest of Mark's contribution as an entrant are remarked in Chris's minutes at end of them. So as Editor I am going to cover a portion now to better illustrate the totality, also show some faves-mb



Mark's Martin Mars is no small thing indeed, but when you surround it with a large number of disparate aircraft in the same scale, you really appreciate all of them more, I think. Here is his JRM, with Focke Wulf Triebflugel in foreground. Now you can get better idea what his dad's FW will look like, and see some of his "Other F's"...



All the rest of Mark's entries were considered as one "F-ed Up Collection", comprising his F Models in 1/144 scale, and as you'll see, covering a goodly range. Just off the JRM's wing tip, NA Texan T-6 in Blue Angels': Beetle Bomb" faux JAAF scheme, the "opponent Zero" in their original aerial demonstrations. A real JASDF CH-47 Chinook, a late model Bell Hueycobra also JASDF, 5 bladed blue USAF H-3, then another Chinook in a darker camo scheme but also JASDF. Less sharp in background, Ki-115 civilian, USAAF B-24, H-3 Emily JNAF Flying Boat, Hawker Sea Fury, Bf-109F, Mitsubishi F-3, TBF Avenger, TBD Devastator, lovely Mavis. In fact, since there's just enough room, here's a sharper look at Mavis, with her neighboring E-2 Hawkeye ...











Although it may seem like it, I still haven't gotten all this collection portrayed, just giving a better idea of the range of subjects, not exactly often one would see such a gathering in full size or scaled. So bear with me here

Yes, if you guessed that blue F8F Bearcat is the "other Beetle Bomb" of Blue Angels, you're on it, That F-4EJ Phantom is in anniversary JASDF colors.







Alright, I am going to wrap up this collection coverage for now, as you may have guessed, there's another...





**Kent McClure**'s PM 1:72 Su-15 Flagon was present, in some paint — Kent said he built it mostly for scribing practive.

Yessirree Bob, I advised you ahead of time. A bit more of Chris's minutes regarding Kent's other entries will be coming, for right now the Editor gets to fill in the blanks for illustration.

Above is a look at the entire group. After that, we will get a gander at the individual members and their status.




It's finished, and it's a Hellenic Air Force F-4 Phantom. Really.



Joining the Phantom in finished state is a Dutch PBY. Yes, that's a Lockheed Blackbird, single seater, WIP.





While having no knowledge what the base kit billed this as, the original Blackbirds were in fact single seaters (A-12s for the CIA) and given what this is, I would argue it's eggstrordinarily accurate in all relevant manners.

Yes, that's an F4U Corsair on the way, nice office!



In some ways, this MiG-15 almost not Eggxaggerated given the history of so called "accurate" kits in past...







Kent's camouflage work on this JASDF MV-22 Osprey is very deftly done.

Nice work on the detailing too



Kent's Avro Lancaster is shaping up nicely including the proper RAF Interior Green where needed. Below, a last look at some of his "FUNTASY" collection in progress, before we go on to the next avid competitor

**Mike Schwarze**'s F-collection wasn't quite started but he had the kits — the Testors/Italeri 1:48 "Ferret C" and the Testors F-19, two speculative stealth fighters from the 1980s.



**Randy Ray** also had an entry in the unfinished end of things, with his intriguing FJ-43 Toyota here.

He has gone to great lengths to be extremely accurate in the colors as well as the outfitting of this kit which he has much good to say, along with how much work it is.

And the winners were... in the F'ed up collections category, it was Mark Balderrama with his enormous collection of 28 F-Toys pre-built models. He picked these up — and many more — during his recent visit to Japan. The subjects included a CH-47, a B-52, a TBD Devastator and a G4M bomber, among many others. In the Fantasy category, the winner was Kent McClure with his collection of egg planes, which included a PBY-5 Catalina, an SR-71 Blackbird, an F-4 Phantom II, an MV-22 Osprey, a MiG-15, an F4U Corsair and a Lancaster. In the Axis Fighter Category, the winner was Ron Wergin, with his Italeri 1:72 Macchi C.202 Folgore, his Tamiya Fw 190D-9 and his Hasegawa Fw 190F. And the winner in the Un-Finished category was Randy Ray, who's still working on his AK Interactive Toyota FJ-43 SUV in Israeli markings, having weathered the wheels and interior and assembled and painted the various accessories that will go inside the vehicle- *chris fini*







While yes, space was at a premium, don't let my picture lead you to believe that D.J. here was brandishing in order to defend his work area. He's defending the beginner entries across way



There's Aaron, guarding the exit.











While a goodly number of great subjects are molded, offered by Japanese model companies in the past and on through to today, that basis alone won't work here

Sorry, yes the splendid Tamiya aircraft, armor and auto models for non Japanese subjects are not eligible for this event, which also applies to Hasegawa, Bandai, FineMolds, etc items.


If however, one were to say depict an actual captured aircraft, armor vehicle, etc that was thusly employed by Japan, that would be perfectly okay and wouldn't as well be penalized if the kit(s) used were not Japanese.

This also would be acceptable in cases where Hypothetical or madly fantastical fictional premise was employed for your entry subject, so give it some thought.

Gundam subjects may end up as a separate subset for judgement as very likely an abundance could be competing as they neatly fit theme here unquestionably


