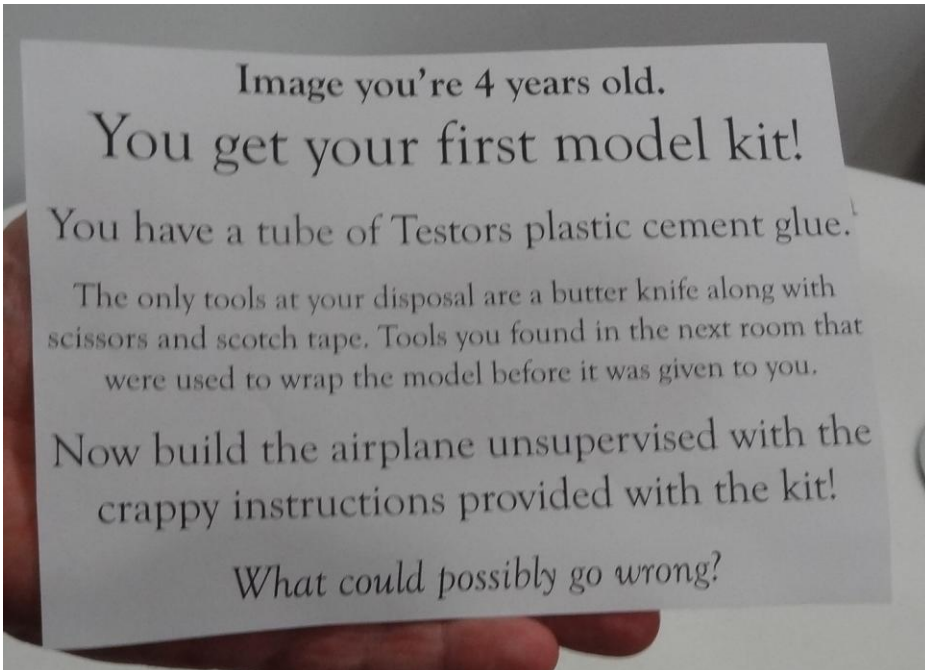

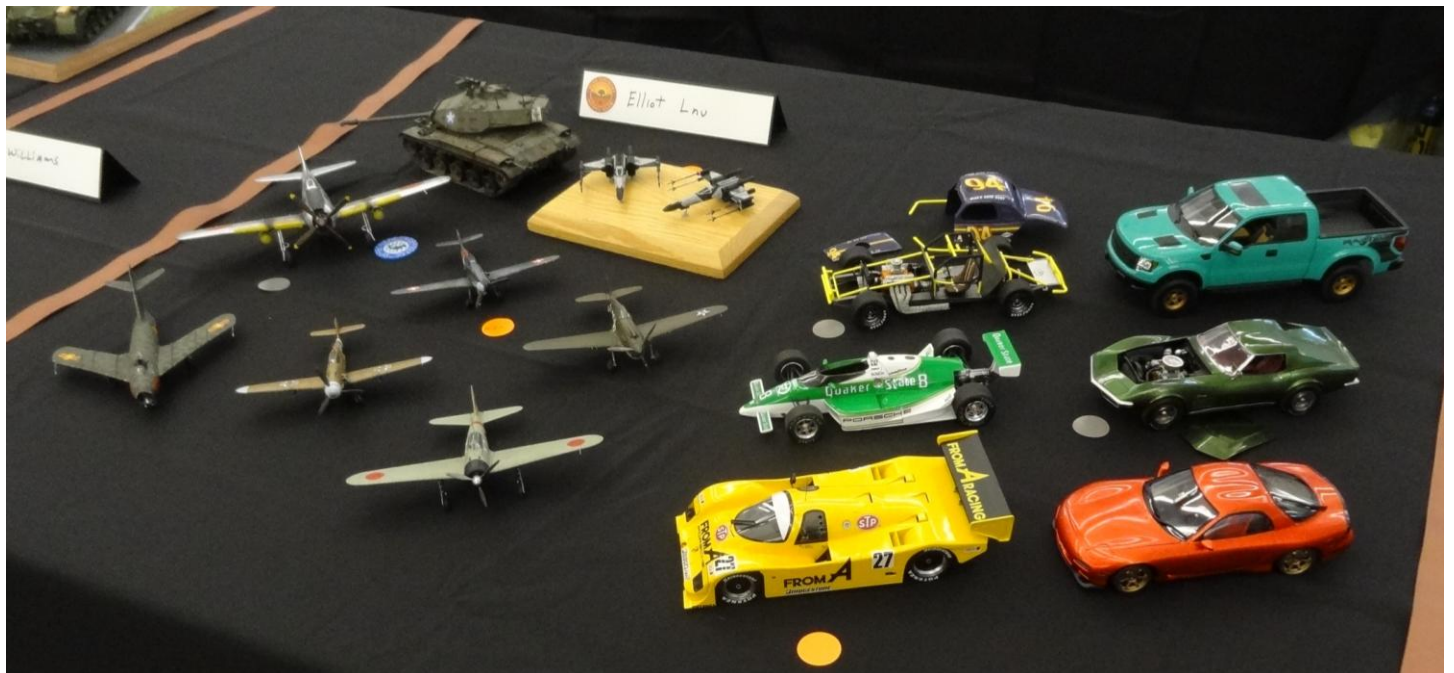

*April 11 2026 saw us returning to a familiar well loved venue years later in a new way with Wine Country Modelers of Sonoma County leading the charge. Above shot is early in day several open spaces soon filled !
One difference from "the usual shows in R-9" is illustrated below, you entered your items all in one sitting...*





Again, these pictures were taken by Editor early in the show day, after he got his bearings upon arrival.



So again, although already a prettu good bunch of models were on the tables from a healthy number of modeler entrants, more yet were coming along to take on all the offered display space. As well then to enjoy getting a further improved version of their Gold, Silver or Bronze judging entries system which was first tried out two years ago by the club hosts. That "Evolution of Modelling" theme event at the Rohnert Park Community Center saw this bold move by a veteran R-9 club have a pleasing record for them in turnout. That it also gave impetus here. With "EoM", they had learned a lot about what worked or what needed improvement for next step which saw them return to Petaluma Community Center, an alma mater of very good contests in past.

Besides putting together a very good in depth online presence well enough ahead of time so you could learn what the details of what the "G S B" judging and awarding process was, so you would be better prepared and less in a position to let any disparaging comments be your guide so maybe no show, they also had offered all an "early preregistration" too !

Okay now here you can mayhaps see how much space in the rear was filled in and also here now is the third and final residence that fit all his entries, my good friend and IPMS Monterey Bay hero Ramon Lomeli, his models are in between the red stripe at green AN-2 Colt and the red stripe on right near flying B-17...



Ramon had to try out two other placements before getting this one provided which was a huge help and great to see on display. Bob Phillips no slouch either, coming from Stockton to show these lovelies below. Go SJVSM !





Dennis Meyers had another display that not only well captured his expertise in scale modelling right there on the front line, it also well illustrated what I find a benefit for achieving enlivening the viewing public who may not even be modelers, competitive or otherwise. Here on one section of table, you have several scales of Jet a/c, Prop a/c, military vehicles of several types, figures both full and bust format. One gets direct information this modeler has a variety of interests, there are some nice models of sometimes familiar sometimes not, subjects.

Next to him, I espied a personal rather obscure favorite of mine which I know our current SVSM President Eugenie shares a fondness for. Her rendition of this 1/72nd Yakovlev Yak-6 still the best one I have seen, still... Have to include this shot as an admiring nod to this builder for even doing it and an applause again to Eugenie



Alright, now if you didn't already know, yes they were awarding Gold, Silver, Bronze to individual models within a single entrants items as the curated Judging teams saw fit to as per their outlined criteria, which if you have been through it you will get the direct message these ARE NOT Participation trophies and you may not even get one even if you have entered what you think are an abundance of your best "winning class" models



However, WCME did again offer several Special Awards such as we are used to at "usual contests" and I happened to have sponsored one myself. Above is an example of one, won by a Fremont Hornet for his AEG.

Here is the great collection of motorwarks by NNL West guru Mike English, who won the Best Auto Subject I sponsored for this event. Yet I unfortunately didn't even get the T-shirt much less a picture of the bloody award



And in keeping with the WCME tradition, Special Awardees also got a bottle of wine for each one !



And to finally get this record straight, the Airfix Meteor F8 and Bandai Gundam here were trades to me for an Airfix Shackleton AEW and an Eduard 1/48th Special Edition B-17 (not shown). I also won the 1/16 Tiger seen here in big raffle. It's now part of the upcoming TC-18 raffle pool. Winning was fun, end results better.



All in all, the first big show of Region Nine 2026 event year went off well as it was premised, and had a plenty large and wide ranging attendance. My hopes that we see this event repeated in the future, to be sure, make it so

A “ JOOB*-alant ” Look at the Hughes Egg Beater

*JOOB = Just Out Of Box (*blame the Editor for that part*)

Another tongue-in-cheek review here. This time it's a Hasegawa kit, number 52196 – No.7 in the Egg Girls Collection.

Actually, it's the egg-plane rendition of a Hughes Model 300 helicopter done up as a police traffic helicopter.

And as an added bonus this kit comes with a 1/20th scale figure of an anime stylized policewoman.

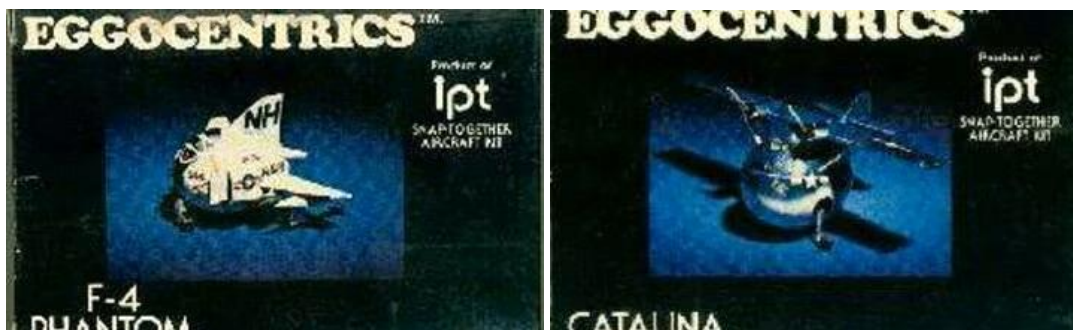
If you are not familiar with the concept of “egg planes”, here's a brief tutorial. As the name implies, these are caricature kits of aviation subjects using the basic ovoid egg shape as its main characteristic.

Some aircraft seem to naturally fall into this category as the prototype of the kit subject “looks” like an egg. For example, the F-4 Phantom, the PBV Catalina, the MiG-15, the AC-119. Even the SR-71.

It's not too hard to “see” the basic egg shape in the real planes.

The first “egg” plane that I remember seeing was an F-4 Phantom. It was produced by a company called IPT Inc (Industrial Promotional Toys) back in 1975 (at least that is the copyright date on the box).

It was part of a line of kits called Eggocentrics.

There were 6 kits in the series - the F-4, A-7, DC-10, Boeing 747, Boeing 727 and the PBV – and were “Snap Together” kits. I had the F-4 and the PBV. I don't remember when I picked up the kits, but I think that they faded into obscurity rather quickly.

Flash forward to 1978 and Hasegawa brought out their Tamago Plane series, and Hasegawa has been going strong producing “egg” planes since then. (*author's note: Tomago is the Japanese word for egg*).

In 2018, Hasegawa began pairing some of their “egg” planes with 1/20th scale resin anime girl figures as “Egg Girls”.

Since then other companies have joined the “egg” bandwagon including Meng, Fujimi and AFV Club, and they have branched out to include ships and armor subjects. But those subjects seem to only marginally fit the “egg” theme.

However, Reskits have started producing aftermarket cockpit sets for some of the models. And they are not too bad, mainly hacking out the kit's old “cockpit” and dropping in the NEW Reskit one.

Now on to the subject matter at hand – the Hughes Model 300.



Hasegawa's Amy McDonnell and the Hughes Model 300 (kit #52196)

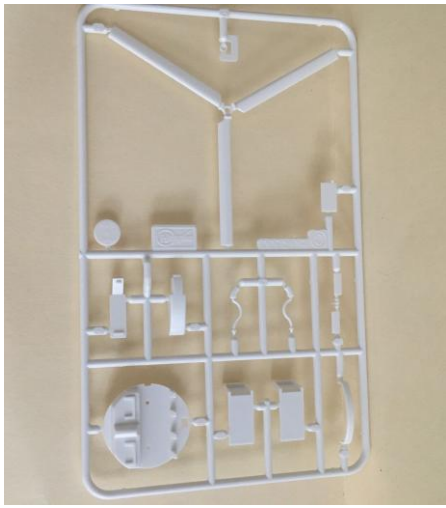
This helicopter (for that fact any “bubbled style” helicopter) is a perfect choice for the basis of an egg kit. Why?

Because, seriously, it looks like an egg!

The Hasegawa kit has 22 parts on 2 white sprues and 2 clear parts on a single sprue. There are no obvious ejector pin or sink marks on the white pieces.

The clear parts are okay and luckily are separated along the vertical plane (left and right halves). Unfortunately, they were not bagged separately from the other parts. But, luckily, the “glass” appears not to have any scratches on it.

The sprue gates are thinnish, and there was no flash on the model to speak of.

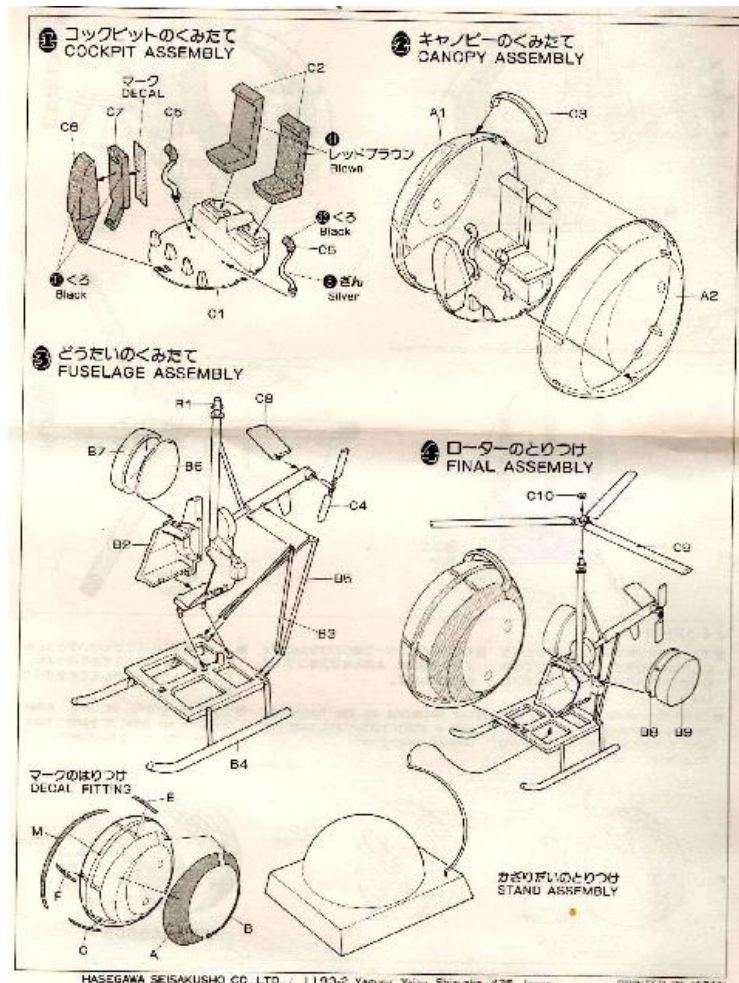
The figure of “Amy”, the policewoman, was bagged separately and consisted of 9 pieces of flesh colored resin.

The figure appeared to be cleanly cast with no visible air bubbles, but it does have some flash that needs to be cleaned up.

The instructions are on a 6 7/8" by 18 3/4" sheet of paper, quad folded. The outside of the instructions is the painting guide for the helicopter and Amy in grey scale, while the inside is the 4-step assembly guide for the helicopter and 1 step assembly guide for Amy.

Decal Sheet



Finishing off the box's contents is a 2 5/8" by 5 1/4" decal sheet. There is no indication as to who produced the decals, but the decals appear to be properly in registration with no excess carrier film.

A nice added touch is the inclusion of "eye" decals and uniform patches for the figure.

When all is said and done, I think this will turn out to be a pleasant and relaxing build, including the figure.

The helicopter is basically an all-black affair. And Amy is in a dark blue policewoman's outfit.

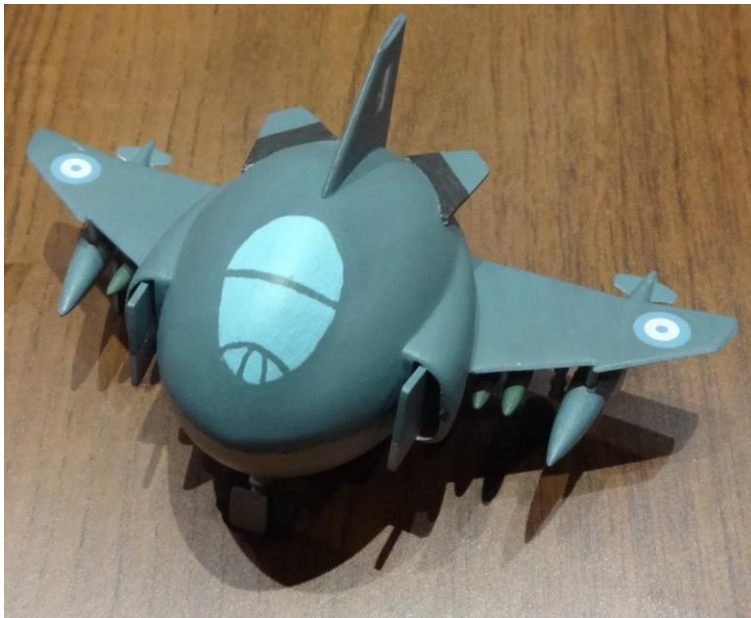
Currently, Hobby Link Japan shows this kit as discontinued with the MSRP being shown as just over \$21.

Neither Amazon nor Hasegawa's home page show the Amy McDonnell/Hughes 300 kit being available.

Or any of the Egg Girl Collection for that fact. For the fun of it, I went to eBay and found 4 examples of the Amy McDonnell/Hughes 300 kit going for anywhere between \$37 and \$65 dollars. Oh well, another lost opportunity.

Just as a PS to this review, I have a total of 8 egg planes – 4 of which have not been built yet. Of the built kits, I have a Greek Phantom, a Cambodian MiG-15, a Japanese MV-22 Osprey and a Dutch PBX Catalina.

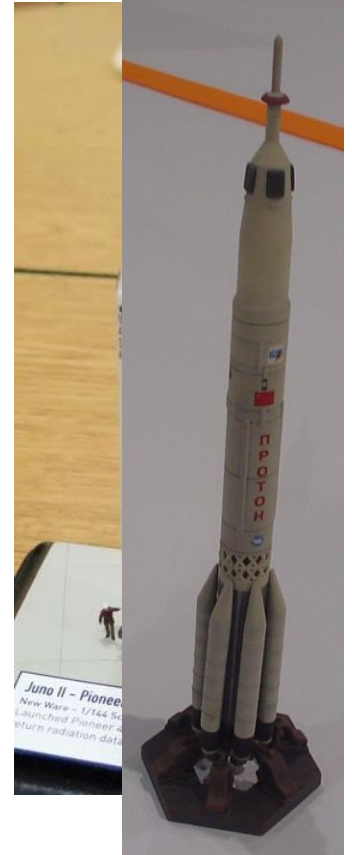
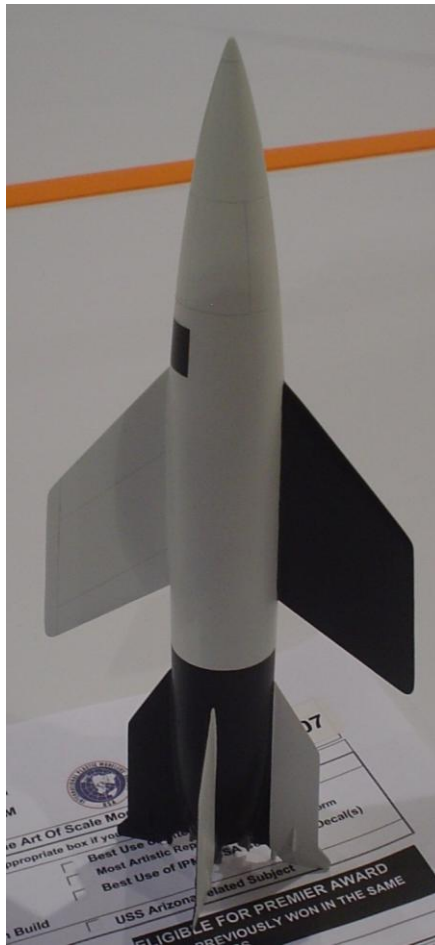
The unbuilt kits include a partially built SR-71, and unbuilt Grumman TBF/TBM, the Hughes Model 300 and a VF-15 Strike Valkyrie. I've got the Reskit cockpits for both the SR-71 and TBF/TBM, while both the Hughes 300 and VF-15 have resin figures. *-kent fini*

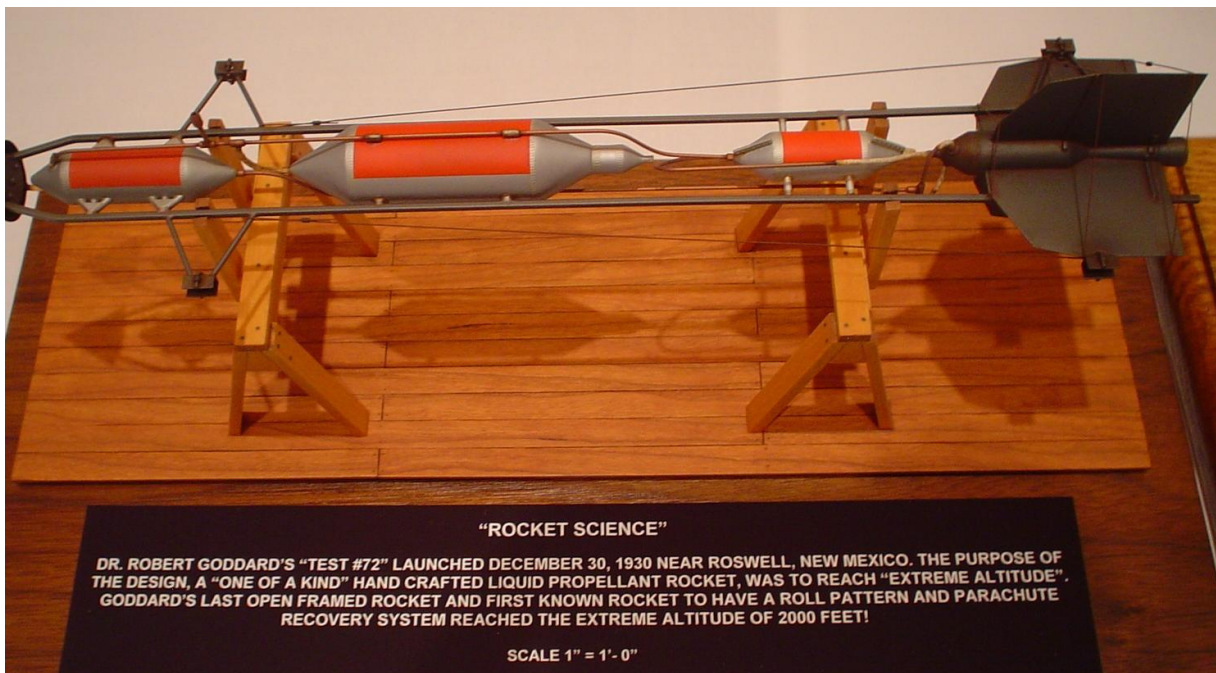
