The 16 of us had a great time at the 17th Tri City Classic model contest hosted by the friendly and well organized IPMS Fremont Hornets Chapter. The IPMS (International Plastic Modler's Society) Fremont Hornets have been around since 1977 and meet the second Friday of each month at Games of Fremont. Like always, they created a very welcoming atmosphere and were very accommodating.

Aaron, Adam, and Mark have been attending the IPMS Tri City Classic for years with Aaron and Mark being active members of the group. Since Char's Fantasy Model Club's founding back in 2023, those 3, along with Emilio, encouraged other members to attend and we have steadily had more members attend and participate, with the 16 members at this year's contest being a new record for attendance. On top of that, 15 of the 16 members entered in the contest.

There were over 60 categories with over 320 total entries this year. There was a total of 39 entries across the Gundam categories and a huge increase in participants in the "Wargaming warhammer et all" category for sci fi miniatures.




Left: Some of the Gundams in the 1/144 and smaller category. Right: Sci Fi Vehicles category

This year we had a record 10 members winning including Aaron, Adam, Brayan, Jarryl, Lee, Mark, Matt, Scott, Steven, and Sydney!




